

Getting the most out of your Hugh Tracey Alto Kalimba

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Congratulations on your purchase of an Alto Kalimba. The Alto Kalimba has 15 notes and usually covers exactly two octaves in the key of G, but there are many alternative tunings. The tuning will define the universe of songs accessible to the instrument, and there is a huge body of music accessible to the Alto Kalimba in standard G tuning.

The kalimba in this photo has an electronic pickup (that black spot in the lower right corner is the ¼ inch jack). The electronic pickup is an optional feature on many Hugh Tracey kalimbas. This kalimba is mounted on a resonant box - again, not all Altos are box mounted. The Celeste Alto and the Goshen 15-Note are mounted on a sturdy, flat board, gorgeously finished like all our kalimbas. But different though they may appear, they all have exactly the same tuning and all can play the same music



This year I will celebrate 30 years of playing kalimba, and I must admit that the kalimba is one of the best things in my life. 


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Kalimba Tablature

Kalimba tablature is a map of the kalimba with note symbols placed on the tines you need to play, starting at the bottom of the page and working up to the top. The gray columns represent the painted tines, and the black line in the center indicates an invisible dividing line between left and right (that is, the low G is usually played by the right thumb). All of the Kalimba Magic books use this intuitive yet powerful and expressive tablature.





Instructional Resources for the Alto Kalimba

The Alto Kalimba in its standard G major tuning is one of the most powerful kalimbas in existence. There are thousands of songs it can play, and there are seven Alto Kalimba books and nine Alto Kalimba downloads to date. If you want to best utilize the books and downloads to learn to play the Alto kalimba, you should stay with the standard G Major tuning.





Alternative Tunings for the Alto Kalimba * Please note that most of the alternative tunings will NOT work with the books and downloads.


Standard G Major tuning for Alto Kalimba




Another A Blues tuning for Alto Kalimba




E-tuned Alto Kalimba - Reads Alto Tabature



Alto tuned in A Read regular G Alto Kalimba tablature




G "African" tuning for Alto Kalimba




Top row: "degree" of the note in the scale Middle row: cents flat or sharp for african tuning

Bottom row: closest western note


Evil tuning for Alto Kalimba



G Minor tuning for Alto Kalimba




F Major tuning for the Alto Kalimba

C-tuned Alto Kalimba



The C tines are marked with "• " to remind this is the ROOT

The C-tuned Alto Kalimba is made by changing the two F# tines to F naturals, which is accomplished by pulling them out (making the vibrating length longer) by a few millimeters. This is one of the easiest retunings there is, and if you don't like it, it is easy to put the kalimba back into the standard G major tuning.

With the 5th of the scale in the bass note, different songs are accessible to the instrument.
